WHO ARE WE

CINGS (China Institute Next Gen x Serica) is a group of Next Gen changemakers in the U.S. and China. Together, CINGS members foster cross-cultural dialogue and put into practice the principles of strategic philanthropy and social innovation.

China Institute, co-founded in 1926 by Dr. Hu Shih and John Dewey, is the leading independent non-profit in New York City whose mission is to deepen understanding of China through art, culture and education. **The Serica Initiative** is a non-profit organization that pursues its mission of convening a community of global changemakers to advance positive social impact between the U.S., China, and the rest of the world.

The **U.S.-China Philanthropy Initiative** began in 2018, when China Institute hosted a group of China Global Philanthropy Institute students for a week of educational programs, culminating in a **U.S.-China Philanthropy Dialogue** with Susan and David Rockefeller, Steven Schwarzman, Anla Cheng, Betsy Davidson, and others. That exchange has evolved today into **China Institute Next Gen x Serica (CINGS)**.

CINGS meets regularly to exchange ideas and learn about strategic philanthropy; convenes public dialogue such as this event; and makes grants through its annual Giving Circle.

WHAT IS THE 2024 GIVING CIRCLE

The annual Giving Circle within CINGS provides flexible philanthropic funding once a year to innovative, impact-driven causes. For non-profits, we offer unrestricted funding; for social enterprises, a non-dilutive grant. In addition to funding, we share executive coaching, mentoring, strategic planning, and organizational building capacity through the extensive networks of our membership base and parent organizations. Our support is more than a grant: we help you build capabilities, grow awareness, and accelerate momentum for your social cause.

This year, the CINGS Giving Circle is focused on supporting U.S.-China social impact. We welcome applications from registered nonprofits, for-profit social enterprises, or individuals, working on the following issue areas:

- Environment/sustainability
- Community development
- Health and wellbeing
- Gender equality

We are looking for individuals, organizations, and ideas who share our overall mission of enhancing US-China connection. We will prioritize supporting initiatives for whom the size of our grant would make a material impact.

GIVING CIRCLE CRITERIA

- **Mission and Theme** - Does your mission align with one of our issue areas?
- **Objective** - Does the project qualify as strategic philanthropy, tackling systemic issues?
- **Alignment with CINGS' Core Mission** - How does or will your organization/initiative enhance mutual understanding, dialogue, and knowledge exchange between the US and China?
- **Ability to Execute** – How is your initiative currently positioned for success with respect to its mission? How will you measure the success of your project in the short term and long term?
- **Meaningful Impact in the Short and Long Term** – How does the grant create meaningful and effective impact through the proposed project?

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. The application window is open as of April 18th, 2024.
2. Please answer the application questions below by **May 31st, 2024** and submit to CINGS@chinainstitute.org. (You may submit in English or Chinese.)
3. Receive first response the week of June 14th, 2024. You will either be asked to interview or will be informed that your application was not accepted.
4. Interview window: June 17th-26th, 2024
5. Final decision: June 28th, 2024
6. Upon acceptance, onboarding to be completed in early July

CINGS (China Institute Next Generation x Serica) 由一群美国和中国的青年组成, 以促进跨文化对话和社会创新为目标, 开展慈善资助。CINGS定期围绕战略慈善的主题开展共学和交流, 并组织相关活动。此捐赠圈为**CINGS**的旗舰项目, 每年, CINGS成员会以捐赠圈的方式, 围绕一个社会创新类的主题, 进行联合资助。

CINGS由China Institute (华美协进社) 和Serica联合发起, 前身为美中慈善倡议 (U.S.-China Philanthropy Initiative)。China Institute (华美协进社) 是一个现坐标美国纽约的独立非营利组织, 由胡适博士和约翰·杜威于1926年共同创立, 其使命是通过艺术、文化和教育加深对中国的理解。Serica计划是一个非营利组织, 致力于召集全球变革者社区, 推动美国、中国和世界其他地区之间的积极社会影响。

美中慈善倡议 (U.S.-China Philanthropy Initiative) 始于2018年。华美协进社为中国全球慈善学院的学生举办了为期一周的教育项目, 与苏珊和大卫·洛克菲勒、苏世民、程安拉、贝琪·戴维森等人开展了救美中慈善合作为主题的对话。如今, 这个项目已经发展成为CINGS。

关于2024年捐赠圈

CINGS发起的年度捐赠圈每年向社会创新行动者提供小额、灵活的慈善资金。对于非营利组织, 我们提供非限定性资金; 对于社会企业, 我们提供非稀释性资助。除了资金支持外, 我们还会通过我们的成员和母机构的网络资源, 为资助伙伴提供战略和组织建设方面的辅导。我们的支持不仅仅是资助: 我们希望能够帮助伙伴们建立能力、提高认知, 加速前进的脚步。

今年, CINGS捐赠圈的重点是中美沟通与合作。我们欢迎来自非营利组织 (例如民非和基金会)、营利性社会企业或个人的申请, 他们致力于以下问题领域:

4. 2024年6月17日-26日开展线上面试。
5. 2024年6月28日公布结果。
6. 七月上旬完成所有资助伙伴的协议签订。
